Explanation of Determining Nearest Point of Relief: In most cases, there is only one place on the course that is the nearest point to the ball, which is not closer to the hole, and provides relief from interference of the lie, stance, and area of intended swing. It is the point where the ball would be positioned in a simulated stance of how the player would have played his next stroke had the obstruction or condition not been there. In some cases, the nearest point of relief may be in a bush, tree, etc.

- Lift, clean, and place in all drop areas.
- All embedded balls through the green may be marked, picked cleaned, and dropped.
- Penalty Area: stakes determine the hazard line EXCEPT in high water level conditions, in which case the level of the water determines the hazard line.
- Areas marked by blue and red stakes are Conservation or Environmental areas and are not to be entered. Ball is played as a lateral hazard.
- Bare ground around and adjacent to paved and gravel paths is deemed to be part of the path. Relief is available under USGA Rule 24. Please consult other competitors.
- All man-made obstructions, such as electrical boxes, etc. are in play unless it interferes with player's stance of swing.
